Make Reading Personal by writing your child fun and supportive messages.

Write notes to your child with words of encouragement, such as "Have a good day," "I love you," and "You are a great kid." Or, identify something your child can be proud of, such as "You were very helpful today" or "Thanks for doing such a great job cleaning your room." Surprise him frequently with letters.

Mail them to him, hide them under his pillow, put them in his lunch bag, stick them in his sock drawer, or tape them to the mirror in the bathroom.

As you read the letters or notes, point to each word and discuss capital letters and punctuation.
